

## WD-40 ...who knew? 'Water Displacement #40'

### Uses for WD-40

1. Protects silver from tarnishing.
2. Removes road tar and grime from cars.
3. Cleans and lubricates guitar strings.
4. Gives floor that "just-waxed" sheen without making them slippery.
5. Keeps flies off cows
6. Restores and cleans chalkboards.
7. Removes lipstick stains.
8. Loosens stubborn zippers.
9. Untangles jewelry chains.
10. Removes stains from stainless steel sinks.
11. Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.
12. Keeps ceramic/terra cotta garden pots from oxidizing.
13. Removes tomato stains from clothing.
14. Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.
15. Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.
16. Keeps scissors working smoothly.
17. Lubricates noisy door hinges on vehicles and doors in homes.
18. Removes black scuff marks from the kitchen floor.
19. Use WD-40 to remove bug guts will eat away the finish on your car if not removed quickly.
20. Gives a children's playground gym slide a shine for a super fast slide.
21. Lubricates gear shift and mower deck lever for ease of handling on riding mowers.
22. Eliminates rocking chairs and swings of squeaky noises.
23. Lubricates tracks in sticking home windows and makes the m easier to open.
24. Spraying an umbrella stem makes it easier to open and close.
25. Restores and cleans padded leather dashboards in vehicles, as well as vinyl bumpers.
26. Restores and cleans roof racks on vehicles.
27. Lubricates and stops squeaks in electric fans.
28. Lubricates wheel sprockets on tricycles, wagons and bicycles for easy handling.
29. Lubricates fan belts on washers and dryers and keeps them running smoothly.
30. Keeps rust from forming on saws and saw blades and other tools.
31. Use WD-40 to clean splattered grease on your stove.
32. Keeps bathroom mirror from fogging.
33. Lubricates prosthetic limbs.
34. Keeps pigeons off the balcony (they hate the smell).
35. Removes sticky residue left behind by tape.
36. Spray on arms, hands and knees to relieve arthritis pain.
37. Cleans and removes bugs from auto grills and bumpers.
38. Spray a little on live bait or lures and you will be catching the "big one" in no time. \*not allowed in some states.
39. Immediately stops the itch and alleviates the sting from bug bites.
40. Removes lipstick stains on clothing.
41. Spray on auto distributor cap to displace moisture and allow the car to start.

\*The product began from a search for a rust preventative solvent and degreaser to protect missile parts. WD-40 was created in 1953 by three technicians at the San Diego Rocket Chemical Company. Its name comes from the project that was to find a 'water displacement' compound. They were successful with the fortieth formulation, thus WD-40.
